## Local Government Grant Scheme (LGGS) Operating Grant -

DFES have agreed to \$230,000 and increase of \$25k on their original offer for next year's operating budget 2024/2025.

Security systems have now been in stalled at the Denbarker and Perillup fire sheds. With extra work carried out at the Denbarker shed to improve signal strength to the shed.

**GRANTS** – Western Power grants were opened and some of the brigades have submitted applications.
