

Pay My Rates - Yellow

Ratepayers are offered a choice to pay rates in either one, two or four instalments. To qualify for the instalment option, any arrears, plus the full amount of the first instalment must have been paid by the date of the first instalment as identified on the rate notice.

Please note that payments not received by the first instalment date will attract a late payment interest charge.

Pay by special arrangement

The City understands that sometimes people experience financial hardship which makes it difficult to meet all financial commitments when they are due. We are happy to work with you to develop a mutually acceptable payment arrangement.

Please contact the City's Rates Officers to discuss your options. You will be asked to complete a Rates Payment Application and submit this to the City before the special arrangement can be approved.

Please note that this option will also incur an Administration Fee of \$25.

Alternative payment methods

- **IN PERSON**
Pay in person at the City office between 8.30am-4.30pm. The City welcomes payment by Cash, Cheque, Money Order or credit card (MasterCard & Visa).
- **POST**
Send a cheque or money order to: City Perth WA 6000. Please do not send cash in the mail.
- **POST OFFICE**
Pay in person at your local post office.
- **POST BILLPAY**
Pay by telephone via Post Billpay by calling 13 18 13.
- **BPAY**
Pay by Bpay via your Financial Institution. (Minimum payment: \$2. Maximum payment: \$100,000).

About My Rates

Rates account for approximately 71% of the City's operating revenue. The City invests this revenue in our community with new infrastructure and facilities as

well as upgrades and improvements to existing infrastructure such as river walls, roads, paths and drainage. Additionally, the City provides a range of services for our community including:

- Libraries
- Weekly rubbish collections and fortnightly rubbish recycling services
- One hard waste and two green waste verge side collections per year
- Community events
- Parks, playgrounds and sporting facilities
- Community facilities
- George Burnett Leisure Centre
- Aged care facilities
- Senior citizens centres
- Community safety initiatives

Council rates are a contribution each ratepayer makes towards the cost of providing facilities and services to the community. How much you pay depends on the value of your property.

These services include maintenance of foreshore and parks, library services, roads, health, sanitation, building control and operation of recreational facilities.
